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# Our Goals for Student Achievement

## *District Goals*

The Board of Education sets goals for the entire district. The district goals for 2022-2023 are:

The percentage of students scoring at Developing Learner or above on the Georgia Milestones (GMAS) English Language Arts End of Grade Assessment will increase by three percentage points.

The percentage of students scoring at Developing Learner or above on GMAS Mathematics End of Grade Assessment will increase by three percentage points

By the end of the 2022-2023 school year, Todd-Grant staff will effectively use data to increase the number of students scoring proficient and/or distinguished learner on the GMAS by 3% in Math.

By the end of the 2022-2023 school year, Todd-Grant staff will effectively use data to increase the number of students scoring proficient and/or distinguished learner on the GMAS by 3% in Reading/ELA.

### **Grades will focus on the following areas:**

- Phonics Instruction (K-3)
- Building fluency in CVC words (K)
- Increasing Lexile levels, fluency, and vocabulary development (K-5)
- Integrating writing through all core content areas (K-5)
- Citing Textual Evidence (1-5)
- Building Math Fluencies (K-5)

## **In Our Classrooms**
